
Did you know...there are over 23,500 jewels in the tower today and their value is estimated to exceed £20 billion!





This month, we have been celebrating Black History Month. Across the school we have been looking at important figures in the black community. EYFS, they have been learning about the singer Beyoncé; Year 1 have been looking at the runner Mo Farah; Year 2 have researched the life of Simon Biles, a gymnast; Year 3 have explored the dynamic duo, Venus and Serena

Williams; Year 4 have been exploring Oprah Winfrey and the impact she had on her community; Year 5 have had fun looking at the life and career of Muhammed Ali and Year 6 have explored the sporting career of Pele. Children across the school have been learning about the impact that these significant people have had on communities all across the world and the importance of Black History Month.

Year 4 went on a trip to explore the religious places in our neighbourhood. They visited the Old Kent Road Mosque where the Imam spoke to them about the worship that they do in the mosque. The children also learned about what charity work they do, including how they help the local community. Following their visit to the mosque, Year 4 visited St Philip's church where Father David showed them around and spoke about what worships they do in the church and how they support the local community. After their visits, the children looked at the similarities and differences between the church and mosque. They had lots of fun comparing the two places of worship.
