Read most words containing common suffixes

e.g. excitement lonely cheerful shyness

Read a book at their level without hesitating or spending a long time blending the words together

Re-reads books to become more fluent and confident

## Writing

Plans their writing by noting down ideas and key words, including new vocabulary



Write a simple story about their own and others' experiences (real and fictional)

Writing mostly has a clear beginning, middle and ending.

Writes using sentences of different types E.g. statements, questions, exclamations and commands

Use capital letters, full stops and question marks correctly

Use present and past tense mostly correctly and consistently

Use co-ordination or subordination to join ideas

E.g. or / and / but / when / if / that / because

Spell many KS1 common exception words

Holds a pencil comfortably and correctly

# Maths

# Place Value


Count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward

Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numbers and in words

Say the number that is ten more or less from any number within 100

Use the language of equal to, more than, less than, most, least

Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones)





Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; using <, > and = signs

## Addition and Subtraction


Quickly recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20

E.g. 5+15=20 20-8=12

Add three one-digit numbers

E.g. 4+5+7=16

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Discuss and clarify the meaning of new words in a book e.g. I think this means because

Learn a number of poems by heart, making

Predicting what might happen next on the basis of what has happened so far

Answer questions about a book E.g.

the meaning clear when reciting

Who was your favourite character? Why? Why did that happen? How do you think that character is feeling?

Participate in discussion about books and poems, taking turns and listening to what others say

Write capital letters and lower case letters in the correct size

Use spaces in between words



Uses commas to separate within lists E.g. in a noun phrase "the dark, grey sky"

Uses apostrophes for some contracted forms and some singular possession in nouns E.g. it's Daisy's book

Use related facts to derive addition and subtraction facts to 100

E.g. 6+4=10

60 + 40 = 100

Show that addition of two numbers can be done in any order and subtraction of one number from another cannot



Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction

E.g. 5+15=20

20-15=5

Add and subtract 2 digit numbers from 2 digit numbers

E.g. 46+25=71

81-38=43

**Multiplication and Division** 

Recall multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables

Recognise odd and even numbers

Recall the doubles and halves of multiples of 10 to 100

E.g. double 30 is 60

half of 60 is 30
