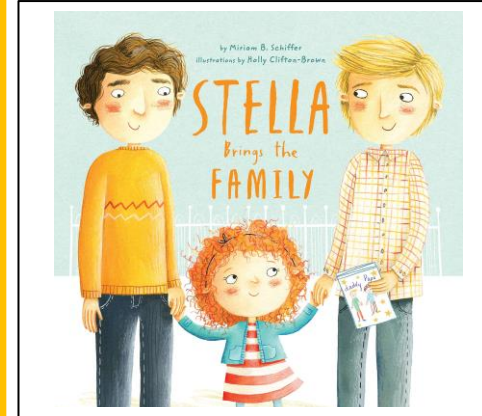
Sound: **ck, e, u**

Personal, Social and Emotional Development.

- Role-play experiences at home and talk about what events are celebrated in your family, e.g. christening, weddings etc.
- Look at pictures of the important events in your family. Why are they especial and important?

Communication and Language

- Look at pictures of different types of jobs. Talk about them. What job would you like to do when you grow up? Why?
- What can you see outside of your window? Talk to your grown up about what you can see. Can you play I spy?

Physical Development

- Play turn taking games with bats and balls to encourage children to share and take turns.
- Can you bake a cake for Stella's party with your grown up? What ingredients will you need to make the cake?

Literacy

- Have you seen a new-born baby? What did the baby look like? Can you draw a picture?
- Can you talk to your grown up about what babies like to do?
 - Can you cook a meal with your grown up?
 - Can you write a shopping list?

Maths

- Can you count up to 4, 5 objects forwards and backwards.
- Make playdough, which involves measuring 1,2 or 3 cups. Ask the child to measure out the ingredients and count the cups.
- Make number cards with the child for different representations of 1, 2 and 3. For example, 3 dots, 3 lines, 2 circles, 2 triangles, 1 square, 1 star etc. Ask the child to compare and see which has more?

Understanding the World

- How are babies and grownups different? What do they like to eat?
- Can you talk about what you want to do when you are older?

Expressive Arts and Design

- Find a song using Youtube and dance with your family.
- Can you draw a picture for your grandparent?
- Can you design your favourite toy using junk modelling?

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
