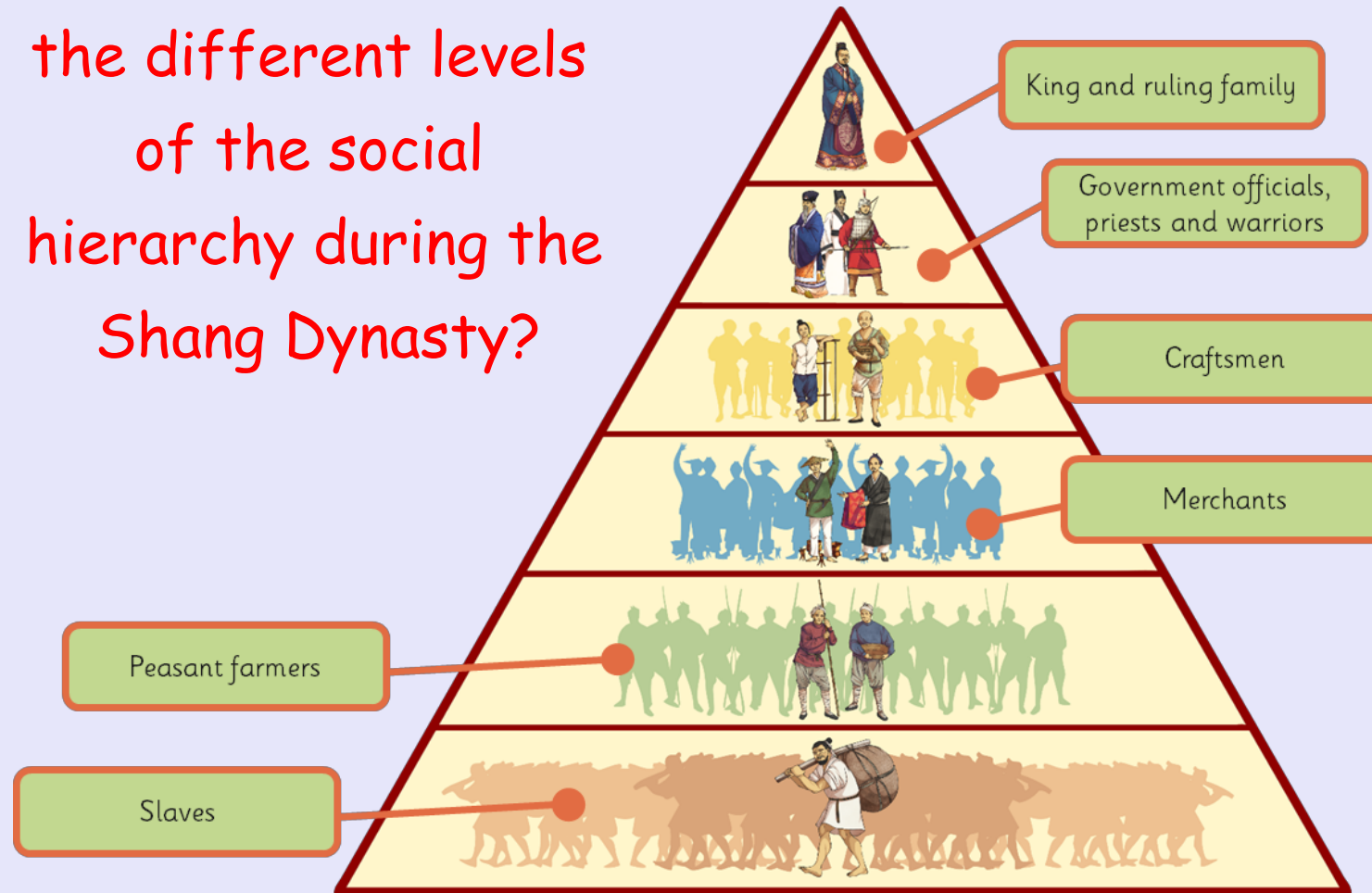

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This week we are going to be writing a letter as a Shang slave who is trying to convince another slave that being buried with Fu Hao is a positive thing.


Why do you think a slave might need convincing to be buried with Fu Hao?
