The clubs were well attended. Federation sports day was very successful. <p>Review: Moving matters worked across both schools with a range of teachers developing their skills and subject knowledge. INSET took place in October for all teaching staff. Intervention did take place to support children with social/emotional needs and had some impact on behaviour across the cohort. Moving Matters ran some G & T sports groups.</p>	<p>CPD to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bespoke 1:1 sessions with staff • Support for PE leader • INSET for teachers on PE skills • Training for children to be PE leaders • Intervention for children struggling with social/emotional issues • G & T sports group 	
<p>Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils</p> <p>Review: Swimming took place in the Summer Term for Year 6. This resulted in 43 children out of 57 children at Phoenix being able to swim 25 metres and 45 out of 54 children at Ilderton achieved the same. Circus skills took place weekly on both sites. Circus skills being led by TAs out in the playground during lunchtimes.</p>	<p>After School Enrichment clubs (see above) Chance to Dance (Phoenix only) Additional swimming for Year 6 (Summer Term) Circus skills session weekly on both sites to allow children to experience a broader range of activities</p>	<p>Additional day for swimming coach to work with all year 6 classes summer Term - £2,375 Circus Skills (1 day per week for both schools) - £4180 per school (£8,360)</p>
