

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

What makes you special? Are you good at doing something? Are you kind, funny or helpful? Draw a picture of something that makes you special.

Can you become an explorer? Use 2 toilet roles and tape together to make binoculars. Play a hide and seek game with someone in your family. Maybe they could hide a jungle toy for you to find!

Communication and language

Can you look at the animals in the stories and describe how they are similar/different?

Can you play a memory game with someone in your family? Find 5 or 6 toys and cover with a blanket. Ask someone to take one away and see if you can notice which one is missing.

Physical Development

Can you practice your pencil grip and copy the names of the animals in the song?

Can you play a game of 'Simon Says' with someone in your family? Follow instructions to move like the animals in the story.

Can you use scissors to cut material or paper into patches to stick and make your own animal inspired picture?

Literacy

Can you make your own lift the flap book? Choose your favourite animals to go under the flap.

Play a game of 'I spy' with someone in your family.

Can you draw a picture of a meal/snack that you made? With help you can label the food writing the first sound in word e.g. t for tomato.

Can you make your own 'Walking Through the Jungle' book? You can draw the animals from the story and with help write the first sound of the animal names.

Maths

Can you find any containers or boxes in your home? How many toys can you fit inside? Can you write the number down?

Can you find the smallest and the biggest animals in the story? Make a picture of them and draw them in the correct size order.

Can you use a toy and tell someone in your family where it is? Is it under/on top/next to/beside/in front of the table?

Can you make your own pattern? You can use things you find at home such as Lego. You could also draw a pattern.

Understanding of the World

Can you look at the markings on some of the animals like the tigers and jaguars? Work with a grown up to find out why some animals have markings like these. Can you use paint, crayons, pens or pencils to copy some of these markings? (Introduce vocabulary 'camouflage'.)

The jungle is always hot and humid. What different weather do we have in England? Can you draw pictures of what the different weather looks like? How does it feel? How do you have to dress in hot and cold weather?

Expressive Arts and Design

Can you create your own jungle animal mask? Using some materials from your house.

Can you make up a dance to your favourite jungle song? Can you perform your dance in front of your family?
