

Choose 3 words and write a sentence for each word using it correctly</p> <p>Sentences are made up of groups of words called clauses that include a subject and a verb. There are two types of clauses – main clauses and subordinate clauses.</p> <p>A main clause makes sense on its own because it is a complete thought. Eg I went to town. It was blue.</p> <p>A subordinate clause supports the independent clause. It does not make sense on its own. It adds more information to the main clause.</p>	 <p>Ancient Egypt</p> <p>Who were the Pharaohs?</p> <p>A Pharaoh was the most important and powerful person in Egypt. The Pharaoh was the political and religious leader of the Egyptian people. 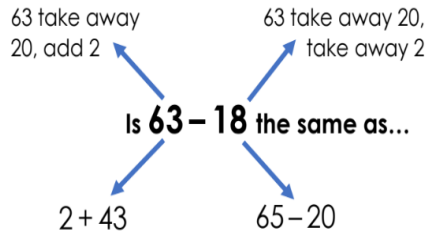

I know... so...

Eg. The sun came out **after** the storm cleared. Evie moaned **because** she didn't like chocolate.

Subordinating conjunctions such as because, despite, if link the **main clause** to the **subordinate clause**.

These sentences begin with a **main clause**. Add a **subordinate clause** to complete it. Use a **subordinating conjunction**. Remember the **subordinate clause** would not make sense on its own!

eg. **Tommy played football despite having a bad knee.**

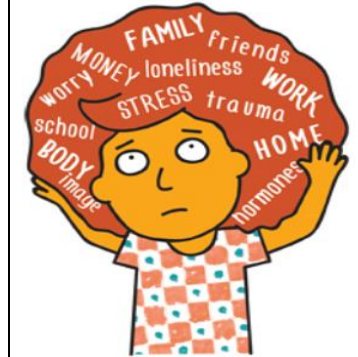




