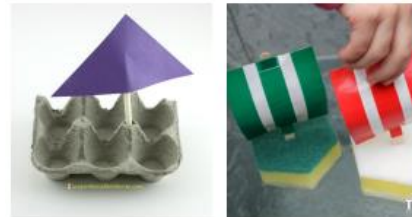
7) Can you write your own sentence with a proper noun, e.g. England, Kenya, Asia, Elizabeth, Henry...etc.
