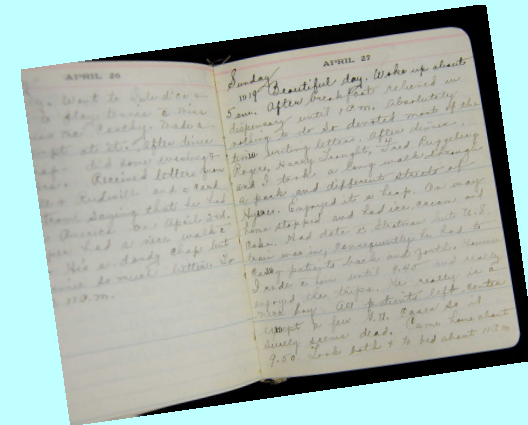

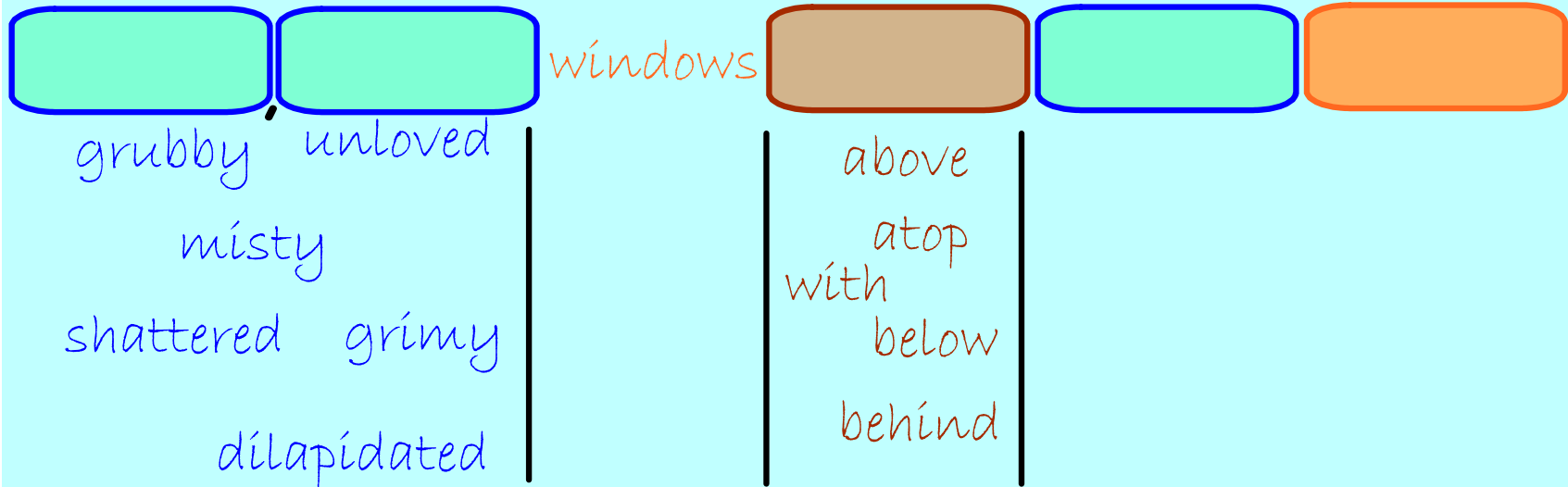

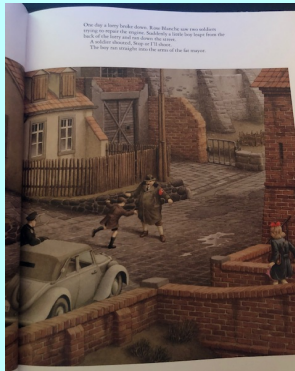

We can rearrange sentences so that our adjectives come at the start.

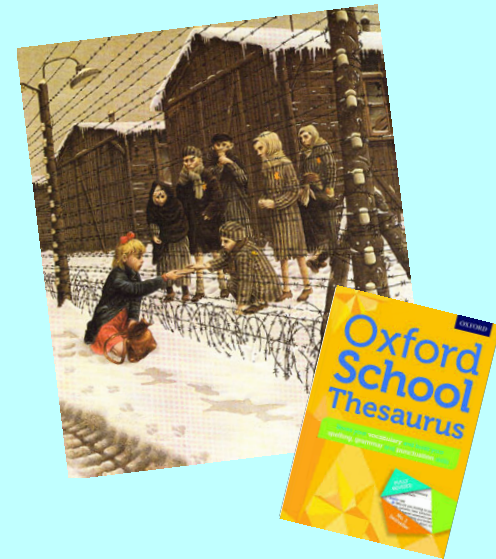
The -ed word has to be about the **subject** of the main clause.
