


What our story will need to include:


Structure:

- 1. Present tense describing the setting, what is happening now.
- 2. Trigger of a flashback
- 3. Recount of previous memories as a flashback (written in past tense)
- 4. Back to the present (ending the story, character's current feelings back to present tense)

Skills:

- 1. Change of tense present to past.
- 2. First person
- 3. Tension/Suspense
- 4. Emotive language
- 5. Imagery/figurative language
- 6. Creating sympathy for the character.

she has taken the potion, which killed her.

Task: In your books, you are going to create your own story map of the events in your flashback narrative. Including the language features needed at each point.

- 1. Descriptive paragraph of the setting. Where Popoca stands as a volcano and the things around him. (Present tense)
- 2. Trigger of the flashback describe the flashback occurring (the sound of the thunder reminds him of the swords clashing)
- 3. Recount the memory in past tense fighting with Jaguar Claw and then coming home to find Itza dead.
- 4. Flashing back to the present-still trying to wake up Itza by blowing ash and smoke out of your crater. (Present tense)
